Proficiency Requirements

- All students must demonstrate math proficiency by a) an ACT math score ≥ 20 (SAT-Math ≥ 500), or b) by passing a proficient exam offered by the Office of Advising and Testing, or c) by passing MATH 130. Enrollment at the MATH 125 or 130 level is required **each** semester until this proficiency is met.
- Students must be enrolled at the appropriate level of ENG 120, 145, & 200 **each** semester until the sequence is completed.
